

Highlands Museum & Discovery Center 2009 Student Art Show

Thirty one local elementary students will see their artwork on display through May 9th at the Highlands Museum & Discovery Center.

Creating a quilt square using Chinese puzzles and mathematical manipulatives was the task hundreds of students set out to accomplish in March at the museum. Local quilt artists judged the students' works for the exhibit. Now, the best of the artwork will be on display during our 2009 Student Art Exhibit.

The museum's "Tangrams, Geoboards, and Quilt Squares" student art exhibit runs from April 18 through May 9. An opening ceremony is scheduled at 11:00 am Saturday, April 18th at the museum.

In partnership with schools and community, the museum attracts and educates young people from around the Tri-State, as well as preserves history and provides a dynamic resource and an integral contribution to the region's quality of life. The museum attracts more than 25,000 visitors each year, and more than 11,000 children attend special activities – workshops, camps, exhibits, events.

Housed in the historic Parsons Department Store, the museum is located at 1620 Winchester Avenue. Museum tours are available from 10 a.m. to 5 p.m. Tuesdays through Saturdays. Admission is \$5.50 for adults, and \$4.50 for seniors, students and children. Members and children under 2 are free.
