

Attic and Book Sale Highlights Poage Landing Days for the Highlands Museum

Maybe you haven't gotten around to cleaning your attic lately, but many friends of the museum have done just that. Vintage items culled from neighboring attics, old and slightly used stacks of books, new glassware, bric-a-brac, kitchen items, vinyl records, antique sewing machines and furniture will be on sale to benefit the museum's educational program. The sale is during Poage Landing Days, Ashland's annual Street Festival, and hours are Saturday, September 19, 10 am-5pm and Sunday, September 20, 12 -5pm.

Featured exhibits during Poage Landing Days are the museum's newest exhibit, "A Step Ahead", located on the Mezzanine Level; and the 25th Anniversary Retrospective exhibit located in the Cecil Fannin Family Main Hall. Also, COMING SOON to the Highlands, the blockbuster exhibit from the Kentucky Historical Society, "Beyond the Log Cabin", Kentucky's Abraham Lincoln; be our guest this weekend and learn more about this once in a lifetime exhibit that will premiere at the Highlands beginning October 2, 2009.

In partnership with schools and community, the museum attracts and educates both youth and adults from around the Tri-State and across the nation. It preserves history and provides an integral contribution to the region's quality of life. The museum attracts more than 21,000 visitors each year, and more than 10,000 children attend special activities – workshops, camps, exhibits, events. An additional 2,500 students are reached by the museum's outreach programs at area schools.

The museum is located at 1620 Winchester Avenue. Museum tours are available from 10 a.m. to 5 p.m. Tuesdays through Saturdays and Mondays by appointment. Admission is \$5.50 for adults and \$4.50 for seniors, students and children. Members and children under 2 are free.
