ASHLAND – The Highlands Museum & Discovery Center, 1620 Winchester Ave., Ashland, KY, opens a new exhibit during First Friday Art Walk on March 6th from 5-8 pm. *The Fabulous Fifties: Elvis and Einstein* will open in the Clothing & Textiles Room. We'll take you back to the days of poodle skirts and saddle oxfords in this fun exhibit. See clothing, hats, and shoes from the 1950s. As a special added bonus, on display will be memorabilia from The Bluegrass Grill courtesy of Rannie & Charlene Cooper. Admission is free on First Fridays from 5-8 pm. Exhibit will be on display through August.

In partnership with schools and community, the museum attracts and educates adults and youth from around the Tri-State. It preserves history and is a dynamic resource, plus an integral contribution, to the region's quality of life. The museum attracts more than 25,000 visitors each year, and more than 10,000 children attend special activities – workshops, camps, exhibits, events. The museum is located at 1620 Winchester Avenue. Museum hours are 10 a.m. to 5 p.m. Tuesdays through Saturdays and Mondays by appointment. Admission is \$5.50 for adults, and \$4.50 for seniors, students and children. Members and children under 2 are free.
