### Preschool Story Time

Hear the story of *Axle Annie* by the “fireplace” using our Music Quilt and fake snow. Participants will also create a winter scene around the letter “W”. (Grades PreK - 2)

### Snow Activities

Using snow powder, learn the difference between “dry” snow and “wet” snow. Find out which makes a better snowman. Also find out other cool things that can be done with snow. (Grades K – 6)

### Cold Things

Did you know that there are things colder than ice. Discover some of those substances, what they are made of and how they are used. Students will also participate in a “sweet” experiment. (Grades K – 6)

### Science of Snow & Weather (StarLab)

What causes different winter weather patterns. How does the weather change what we see in the sky. See different weather patterns in our StarLab portable planetarium and create a cotton ball snow scene.
